


The Importance of Civic Engagement


Interaction with the Public

Process	Description	Leader's Role	Citizen's Role
Public Relations	Builds a positive relationship between person/entity and the public	Initiator	Consumer (Passive)
Public Education	Raises awareness about a particular issue	Educator	Pupil (Receptive)
Public Input	Collects public preferences, concerns and/or reactions	Convener & Implementer	Client (Somewhat Active)
Public Engagement	Fully engages citizens in deliberation, problem solving and action	Partner	Partner (Fully Active)
